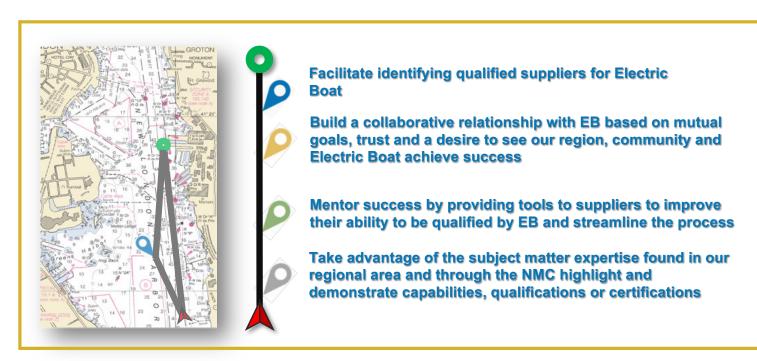








# Opportunities For Collaboration: Charting A Complimentary And Effective Supplier Solution for Electric Boat





## Electric Boat and the NMC are Collaborating Toward Mutual Benefit

EB-NMC collaboration falls within five broad categories:

- 1. Identifying new suppliers
  - Matching needs with capabilities
- 2. Onboarding and qualifying new suppliers
  - Know how on how to search for, bid, become qualified
- 3. Supplier development
  - Cybersecurity, optimization, workforce development, etc.
- 4. Supply base communication
  - Representation and avenues for communication between EB and the supply base
- 5. Preparing for next generation Technology
  - Anticipating future needs



### Opportunities for Mutual Benefit: How Can EB Help or Be Helped By the NMC

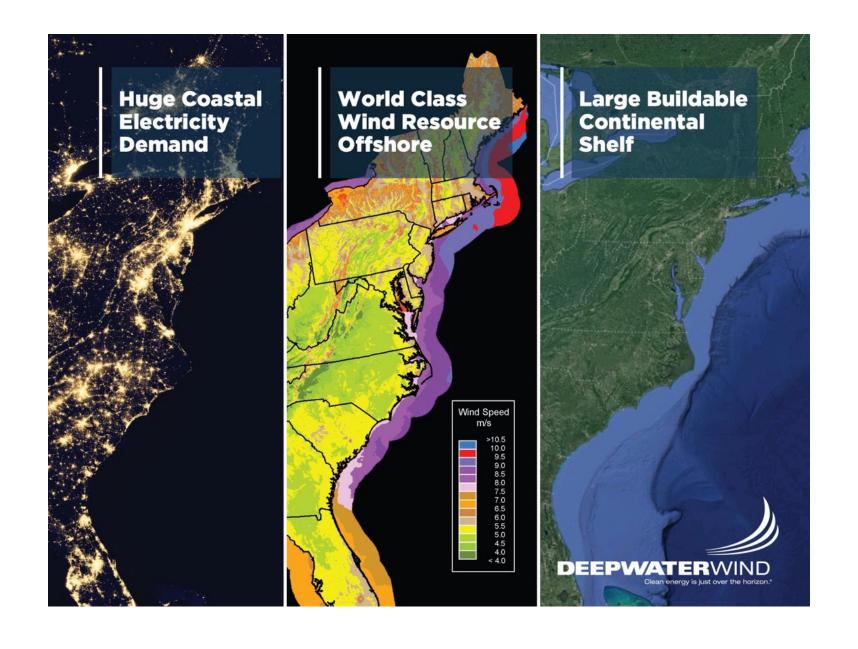
- Assist EB in fulfilling EB Strategic Sourcing work
- Assist EB in fulfilling analysis and technical needs
- Supporting suppliers with services they need to be successful (e.g., cybersecurity, production optimization, etc.)
- Assistance establishing companies with required registrations and certifications (DUNS, Cage Code, NAICS, ISO, etc.)
- Assistance and know-how in how to search for and bid on EB procured items
- Foster collaboratives/joint ventures to support EB deck, tank and structural assembly needs
- Assist EB in pre-vetting suppliers
- Assist EB's shipyard and facility needs
- Foster technology transfer into the supply chain to improve value and address EB's specific needs
- Help EB meet small business, minority owned, and other socioeconomic subcontracting goals



### NMC is Supporting EB Procurement Priorities

- EB and the NMC are currently in discussions to identify initial tasking
- Proposed tasks include:
  - Identifying suppliers to meet EB Strategic Sourcing needs
  - Identifying suppliers to meet EB General Procurement needs
  - Cataloging the current supply base and those wishing to enter the supply base
  - Identifying a local solution to large scale module manufacturing needs
  - Developing a process to offload Strategically Sourced work



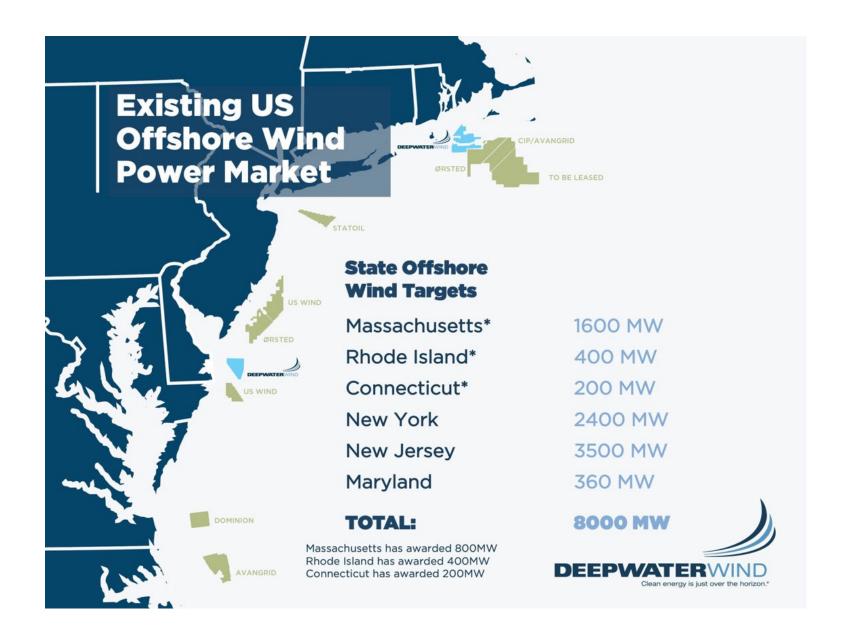








Boeing 747: 250' Block Island Wind Farm Blades: 240'

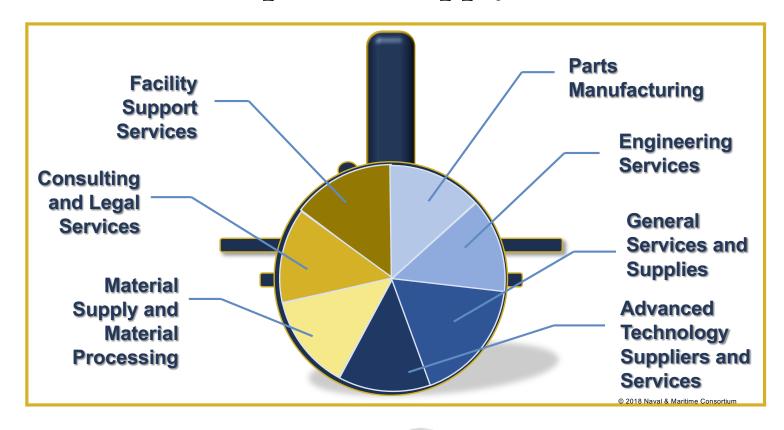

### NMC Members Span the Supply Chain



















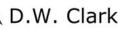

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### NMC Efforts Are Gaining Momentum

- On track to receive CTNext funding, via the Innovation Places program and the Thames River Innovation Place, LLC
  - CTNext is a quasi-public organization whose funding is appropriated by the CT legislature
- NMC received an Economic Development Administration grant for \$62k to support start up efforts
- Orsted US Offshore Wind pledged \$250k to NMC to perform an offshore wind supply chain study
- The Consortium began accepting members in November 2018 and now has 52 members
- NMC is governed by a 10 person Board of Directors and a 20 person Board of Advisors
